We need to create a world where everything is not for sale. We need to build a world where people are valued more than profits, and where the environment is protected for future generations.



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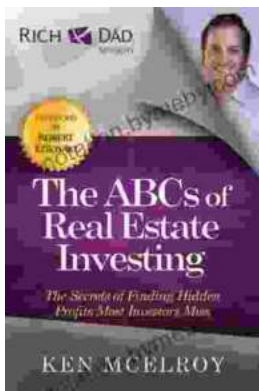
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
